News From Our Mayor, Greg Gent



It's now late February and we somehow have gotten through quite a chunk of 2017. A belated Happy New Year.

Councillors met at my house in late January and had a day with the Chief Executive looking at some objectives for us for the coming year. There will be two priorities amongst a lot of things happening. The first is the Mangawhai Town Plan which should be available for public discussion mid year. This will no doubt be controversial but is well overdue and very necessary. Mangawhai is growing again and fast. Council is issuing around 25 building permits per month currently!! Simply, that growth needs to be managed and planned.

The second priority will be Dargaville. The town is really going nowhere and it is the centre of the western side. We will look at various options including the Library which is way too small for the use it gets. The Pool continues to be expensive to operate and that needs to be looked at.

At our February meeting we considered the first draft of our Annual Plan (budget in non Council speak). That still requires a lot of work as we try and balance ongoing debt reduction with providing adequate service. But that is our reality.

Need a repeat on a script and don't require a check-up with your Nurse or Doctor? You can now order it through the Manage My Health (MMH) App.

We now have access to 'an app' where we can go 'online' to help us manage our own health - keeping us local folk up-to-speed in this quickly evolving world we live in.

We appreciate our rural lifestyles, we value our land, resources and strong community spirit. Good health enables us to enjoy and participate in all that surrounds us. We are fortunate in the Northern Wairoa District to have excellent access to healthcare, which we as a community historically have fought to maintain. Our access to health services has just been enhanced by the uptake of this new technology.

The MMH app is especially useful to manage your blood results, if your results are normal you won't get a phone call.... but for some people it's really important to keep an eye on their numbers, logging into the MMH app will let you see all the test results for yourself.

It's awesome that we can live rurally and still enjoy the benefits this technology has to offer. Manage your health any time any place via the Internet with the Manage My Health (MMH) App.

Benefits - the Manage My Health app will let you:



Those of our readers who have lived in the area for some time, will remember Maurice and Maureen Gwillim. A couple of years ago we featured an article about them. Last year Maurice had to decide between retiring or buying another truck. The picture shows how the decision went. The photo and article below are taken (with permission) from the "NZ trucking" magazine. **J.W.**

Maurice Gwillim started operating trucks in 1965 when he purchased a brand new 1113 Mercedes 4x4 and contracted to Thurston Transport in Ruawai, spreading agricultural fertiliser. Three years on and the lifestyle

working, so he purchased a new Bedford RL 4x4 and continued his contract with Thurstons. In 1971 Maurice married Maureen Morfett, a Northland girl herself from Kaihu north of Dargaville. Maurice's best mate Les Comer drove the wedding car.

Maurice sold the spreading business in 1972 to his brother Trevor and the late Pat Horan and purchased a Bedford SB3 bus from 'Pud' Meale who ran a daily passenger and freight service between Ruawai and Whangarei. The run included the RD 8 rural post deliverycontract out of Whangarei. In 1989 Maurice and Maureen sold the passenger business but retained the freight, operating various trucks increasing in sizeas freight volumes grew. Although the rural delivery run had also doubled in size, it was sold off to two employees. The

late nineties signalled change for Maurice, Maureen and their

three daughters when the decision was made to move from Ruawai to Whangarei. At the time Maurice received a letter from Grenfell Thurston commending Maurice for his service to Ruawai over 30 years, starting as a youngster. The township presented the Gwillim family with a large engraved mirror as an appreciation for their services. Maurice joined United Carriers as a driver in 2001, and shortly after purchased a Mitsubishi GM70, contracting to the company as an owner-driver. He remained with the company until shortly after the Toll takeover in 2009. In late 2009 Maurice took his six-month-old 700 series Hino and joined NZL Group, painting the truck in the well- known green and white livery and continuing to operate out of Whangarei. Late in 2015 Maurice reached a crossroads in his career with some decisions to make. With 700,000km on the clock, replacing the Hino needed consideration. At 70 years of age, should he sell his truck and trailer and retire, or should he continue contracting to NZL Group with a new truck. "I was enjoying the driving," he said, "and if I decided to retire and sit on my backside I would simply go to rot. "It was not all that hard to make the decision in conjunction with my wife, Maureen, and also after some discussion with the management of the NZL Group," Maurice said, "so I went to Auckland and spoke to Ron Price at Trucks & Trailers about purchasing a new Mercedes." Maurice readily admits that if he had not had the support of his wife Maureen over the years, he would not have been in a position to make a decision at all.



Well it's time for the rugby season to roll around again. Conditions may dictate otherwise, with the grounds being like a road, but nevertheless they breed them tough up here in Northland. The Nomads (Ruawai. Seniors) are looking to build on their mid table finish of last year and make a push for a finals berth this year. With a young team, that gained a lot of experience from the previous year, and with the addition of a few other players, the boys are working hard to try make this happen. We had our first muster in Ruawai mid December with a reasonable turn out. Since then we have had a run out at Tinopai trying to make a few extra recruits and a day spent up at Kai lwi Lakes where the lads were put through the wringer in pretty hot conditions. Since then we have been training Tuesdays and Thursdays with a focus on fitness. Exciting things are ahead this year with the biggest shake-up of the competition in years, with four teams added from Bay of Islands (Kawakawa, Moerewa, Ohaewai and Otiria).
